Outreach Plan: Public / Private HBCUs

Overall goals:

- Achieve **100%** voter registration amongst the student population:
 - Increase student turnout in all primary and general elections;
 - Build student confidence in voting and develop the habit of voting as soon as students are eligible;
 - o Build student leadership and increase student involvement in their communities
- Institutionalization of civic engagement into the academic framework; and
- Secure and/or maintain "Voter Friendly Campus Designation"
